



## AIDA Europe Conference Warsaw – 12/13 April 2018

### Conference Theme: *De-Mystifying InsurTech* – a Legal and Regulatory View

The VII<sup>th</sup> AIDA Europe Conference will be held in **Warsaw, Poland, on 12 & 13 April 2018**. The Conference will be organized by AIDA Europe in co-operation with the AIDA Polish Chapter affiliated at the Kozminski University.

The Conference will be, mainly, dedicated to *InsurTech* and the manifold implications technology will bring to the insurance industry and its stakeholders both, from a legal and regulatory, perspective. The Conference is trying to sketch-out a stress test for traditional legal and regulatory concepts. What will be new for the industry, its stakeholders, particularly also for In-house Counsel, lawyers from the private practice and regulators?

Next to the core theme there will, however, also be, similar to past AIDA Europe Conferences, sessions dedicated to *Hot Topics & Key Developments* in the insurance field, as well as the traditional meetings of the AIDA Working Parties, which should gain your interest.

In conjunction with the Conference, the AIDA Europe Scientific Committee invites the submission of academic papers on a number of InsurTech themes. [Click here for details](#). Moreover, the leading papers of authors who are no more than 35 years old will be eligible for the AIDA Europe Scientific Committee Award for Young Authors. Selected papers from the area of InsurTech will be published in a book edited by Prof. Pierpaolo Marano, Catholic University of the Sacred Heart, Milan, Italy, and Dr. Kyriaki Noussia, University of Exeter, UK. The book will be included in the soon to be established AIDA Europe Research Series on Insurance Law and Regulation and published from a renowned publisher.

Currently the detailed program is being elaborated and the responsible teams for the preparation of the individual sessions have taken up-first actions.
