



Dr. Kyriaki Noussia broadly speaking specializes in international commercial law. She is admitted to the Athens Bar as a Greek Barrister (1997) and is licensed to appear before the Greek Supreme Court and the Greek Conseil d' État. In 2003 has participated at an exchange lawyer scheme in terms of which she has worked for a NY maritime law firm. Between 2010 and 2015 she has practiced maritime, insurance and arbitration law in Greece.
